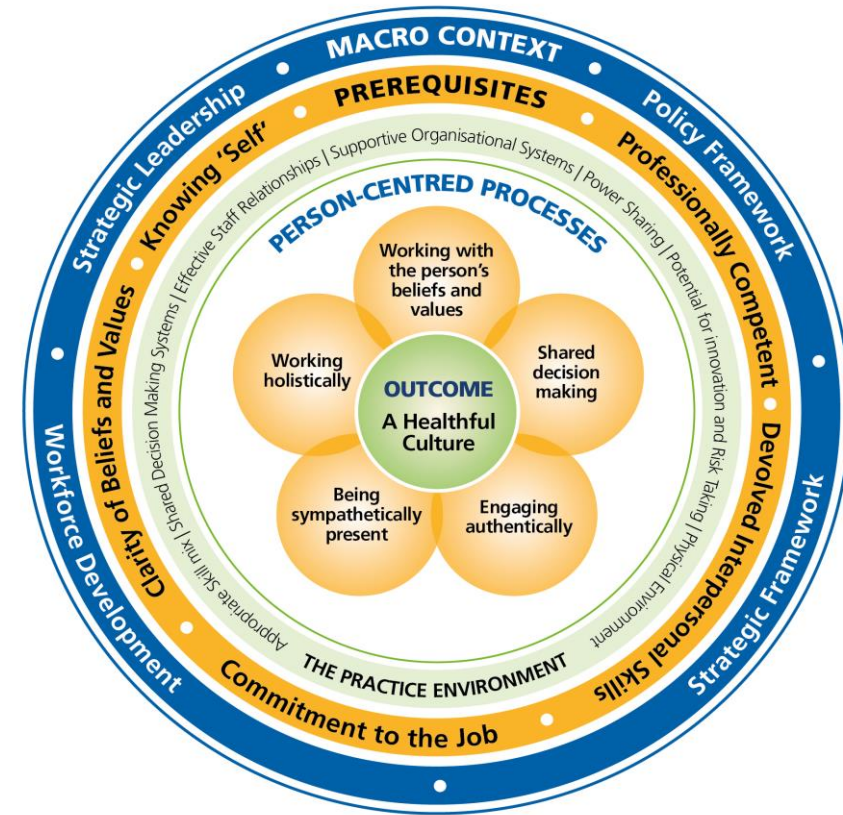

# Underpinning Theoretical Framework: Person Centered Practice

“... an approach to practice established through the formation and fostering of healthful relationships between all care providers, service users and others significant to them in their lives. It is underpinned by values of respect for persons, individual right to self-determination, mutual respect and understanding. It is enabled by cultures of empowerment that foster continuous approaches to practice development and quality enhancement”. (McCormack and McCance 2017)

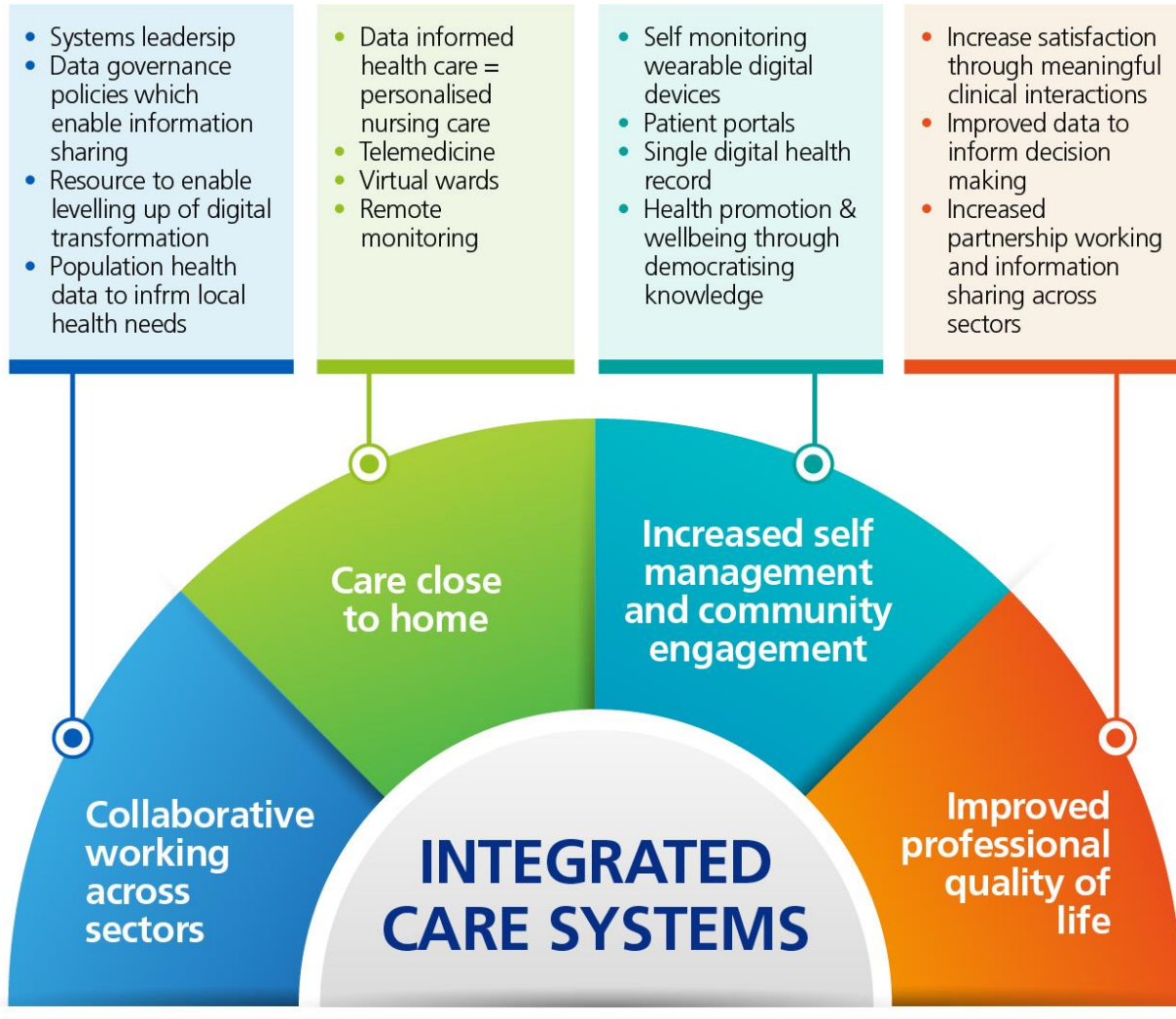
“A healthful culture is described as one in which decision-making is shared, relationships are collaborative, leadership is transformational, and innovative practices are supported. The ultimate outcome is to develop a workplace that enables human flourishing. This is a key factor in how healthcare is experienced and the extent to which the environment supports and maintains person-centred principles has been shown to be critical to person-centred practice. (McCormack et al 2021, p.34).



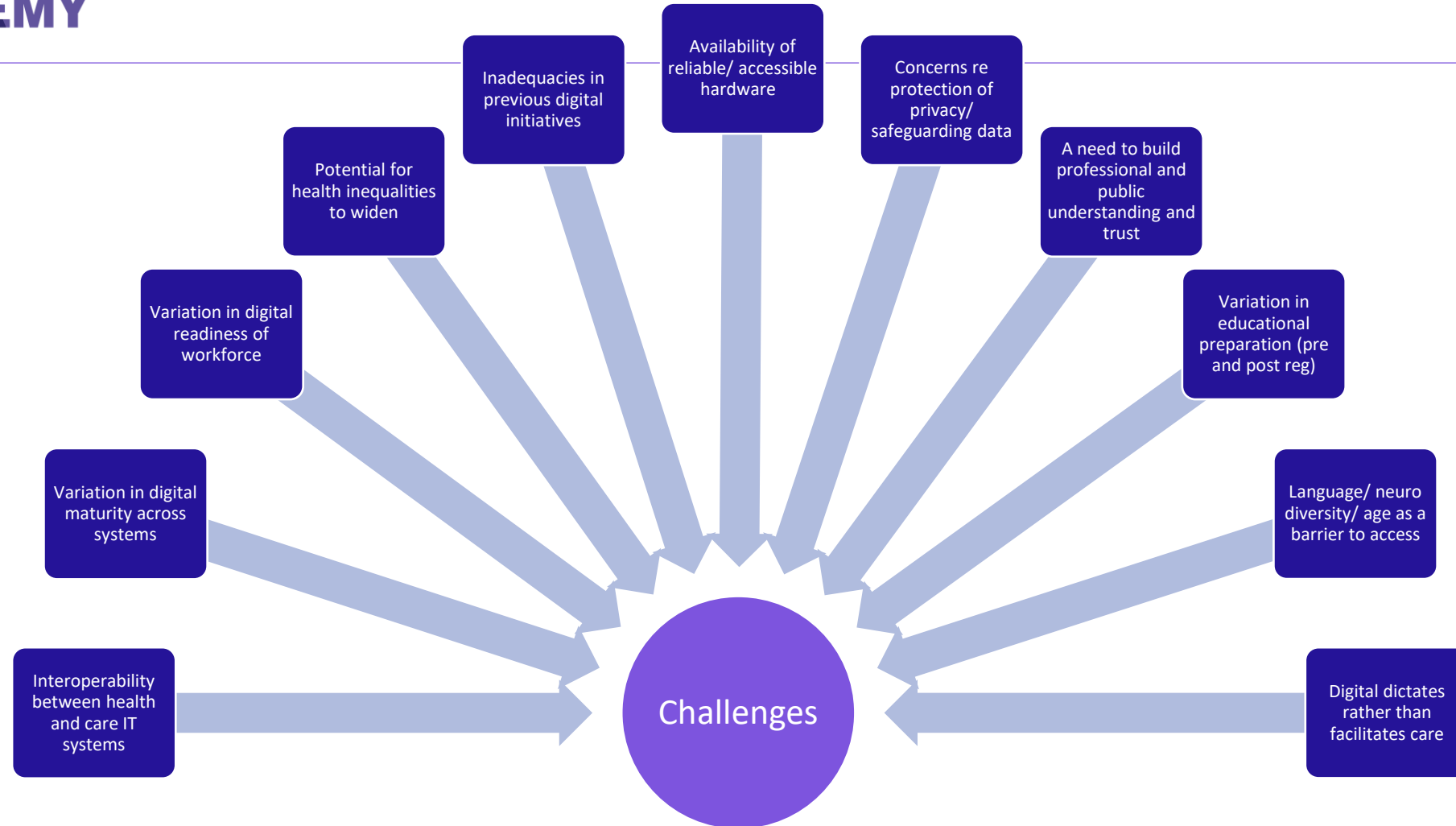
# **Let's Have a Vote!**

## Now

- Digital nursing leader informing every ICB Chief Nurse
- System wide digital transformation plans/ data sharing polices
- Appropriate investment ringfenced to meet the local priorities
- Standards for clinician and citizen centred design and implementation
- Digital equity assessment for every citizen at risk of exclusion
- Plans to generate evidence to demonstrate impact on “healthful cultures” as an outcome

## 5 - 10

- Established and embedded digital nursing teams across systems
- Levelled up access and progression in digital transformation plans across systems
- Data sharing across health and care sectors
- Monitoring of inequalities in access and engagement with digital care interventions
  - Access
  - Alternative
- Evidence of most effective digital interventions to promote healthful cultures

## 20

- Every nurse is a digitally enabled nurse
- System based digital solutions with legislation to support data sharing
- Co-production is standard practice
- Scale up of evidence based digital interventions

# **What does this indicate we need for the future?**

- Interoperability across digital systems within ICS
- Policy/ legislation which enables information sharing across sectors
- Equity of end user access and experience considered prior to implementing any form of digitalised care (personalisation remains the driver)
- Clinicians and citizens routinely involved in the design and implementation of digital solutions
- Education which pays attention to how digital solutions can enhance the meaningful engagement between nurses and citizens and promote healthful cultures
- Education which prepares nurses to co-produce care with citizens
- Evidence which demonstrates the impact of digitally on healthful cultures ie. Shared decision making, enhanced professional relationships, fulfilment in work and increased ability to facilitate personalised care
