
Results of DMA show relative strengths of capabilities and variability across the system



DMA scores across the What Good Looks Like dimensions²



ICS scores across all 7 WGLL dimensions on the core DMA survey¹ help to target areas to "level-up"



^{1.} Average score as scored by individual ICSs; This score is not the aggregate of provider scores within an ICS

^{2.} Scores are weighted according to a methodology that estimates the relative value of each of the 50 capabilities described in the DMA; analysis on DMA results was conducted across 6 different weighting methodologies – results needed to be robust to all six to be included in the final analysis pack. 



- Doctors? They treated patients......








What it was like then.

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

The 'Newcastle Declaration' – why citizens need far better information sharing across health and social care.

The 'Newcastle Declaration', jointly developed by front line clinical information leaders from across the NHS, at the 2015 CCIO Network Summer School, Newcastle, calls for a radical step change on interoperability (information sharing between different electronic systems) to enable truly joined up health and social care.

"We declare that, in order to provide safe and effective health and care for all citizens, health and care professionals require unimpeded access to all relevant information available on those they care for.

"Too often, health and care professionals today lack key information available on those they care for, and have to make treatment decisions without access to all of the currently available knowledge, such as previous care and test results. Citizens and
